DOWNING, J.

Plaintiff/Appellant, Harold Joe Black, an inmate in the custody of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, seeks review of the district court judgment dismissing his suit without prejudice. This suit is for monetary damages. Mr. Black's claims are based on alleged violations of his constitutional rights. The alleged violations involve his conviction, sentence, and time computation that occurred while he was incarcerated in Allen and Caddo Parishes. The mandatory venue for such a suit is in the parish where the prison is located. La. R.S. 15:1184(F).

The Commissioner's June 29, 2007, recommendation, adopted in the district court judgment, fully explains the decision. After a thorough review of the record, we find no error in the district court judgment. This district court judgment is affirmed by summary disposition in accordance with Uniform Court of Appeal Rule 2-16.2A(5). The costs of this appeal are assessed to plaintiff/appellant, Harold Joe Black.
